Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For many of you, I imagine your summer plans are getting into full swing as we enter the month of July: vacations, sports, grill outs, family time, summer camps, and the list goes on. Summer is often seen as a time to take a much needed break and get away from the stresses of work and the like. And so it's great to get a chance to step away for a time to refresh and recharge.

We see this very thing happening in the story of Elijah. He prevailed over hundreds of the prophets of Baal, and then, cast

out and worn out, Elijah runs away and comes to rest under a broom tree. There we find him in 1 Kings 19:

"And he lay down and slept under a broom tree. And behold, an angel touched him and said to him, "Arise and eat." And he looked, and behold, there was at his head a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water. And he ate and drank and lay down again." - 1 Kings 19:7-8

I can't help but think of a snicker's commercial when I read this passage. Someone is whining and complaining and a friend hands them a snickers bar and suddenly they're back to normal. Elijah needed a break and a meal. Essentially Elijah went on vacation. But on that vacation, Elijah doesn't get away from God.

Right after this story of Elijah being fed by the angel and taking his rest under the broom tree, Elijah arrives at a cave and there the Lord promises to speak to him. Elijah could run as far away as he wanted, but he wasn't getting away from the Lord. I'm reminded of one of my favorite passages from the psalms:

"If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me." Ps. 139:9-10

The psalmist recognizes, there's no where he can go to get away from the Lord. And so it is for us. We may go away on vacation, we may even travel to the other side of the world, but we can't leave the Lord behind.

And so with that in mind, though we are in the midst of our summer vacation, don't leave the Lord behind. Stay in His Word. God gives us so many opportunities and different ways to be in the Word. We can read it in our Bibles or even through apps on our phones. We can hear it preached on Sundays (or any other day of the week through the technologies available to us). We can study it and learn it through Bible Study, whether that's personal study or in a group.

Of course, for our children, though Sunday School has ended for the year, we look forward to celebrating Vacation Bible School this month. Remembering the command Jesus gave His disciples in Matthew:

"Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven."" - Matthew 19:14

You can even be a part of this ongoing sharing of God's Word as there is always need for more volunteers for VBS and Sunday School.

So as your summer heats up and your schedule fills up, no matter where you are, remember to make time for God's Word. Study it. Hear it. And share it whenever and wherever you can.

Green, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year.

Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!



From childhood to old age, a life of praise is a life of peace, for when our eyes are on Jesus Christ, we know it is well with our souls.


