Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This may is a joyous time for many. There are a number of things being celebrated this month. We celebrate together as our confirmands confirm their faith and become communicant members of our congregation. We join together with our graduates to celebrate their accomplishments as they finish their schooling and move on to new things.

As we find all these different reasons to celebrate, I am reminded of the words of St Paul from Philippians chapter 4. There we read:

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." - **Phil. 4:4-6**

These words remind us of where our true reason to rejoice can be found: in the Lord. It is He who instructs our confirmands by means of His Word and Spirit. He sees our graduates through their time in school and guides them through each day. He prospers the work of our hands as we work every day to serve Him in so many different ways.

With God's hand in all that we endeavor throughout our lives, it's easy to see why we are called to rejoice in the Lord always, for without Him we would have nothing. The psalmist says it quite well in the 150th Psalm,

"Let everything that has breath praise the LORD! Praise the LORD!" - **Psalm 150:6**As the giver of all good things, we are encouraged to praise God for all the good He has given to us and done for us. Last month we rejoiced together as we celebrated Jesus' triumphant victory over death and the grave. Sunday after Sunday we remember this victory as we worship together in our churches.

All that being said, our rejoicing isn't just about the praise we give to God, we also rejoice with our actions. In Colossians 3, St Paul encourages us:

"Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ." - Col. 3:23-24

Confirmands, graduates, congregants celebrating an anniversary, whatever the case, we are called not just to rejoice in the Lord, but to work as if it is Him we are serving. When studying for a test, we do so as for the Lord. When serving in the church, we serve as for the Lord, not just for the members of our congregation.

As God's children, everything we do should be done in His name and for His glory. When we worship, we worship with all our hearts knowing it is Christ we are worshiping. When we serve we serve with all our hearts, knowing it is Christ we are serving. All that we have is a gift from Him: our Church, our education, our faith, even our very lives. And so we are called to rejoice in Him, to serve Him in all we do. And worship together as we celebrate all His good gifts.

And so this month as you join together with confirmands or graduates or other members of the congregation to celebrate these various accomplishments, let us ever remember to give thanks and praise to God for without Him, none of these accomplishments would have been possible. Let us rejoice, worship, and serve as if we are doing so it for the Lord that in all things we may bring glory and honor to Him. In His Service.

Red completes the acronym, "Bg-Bgs-Pwr." Red is a power color and is appropriate for use on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of "the Lord and Giver of Life," who revealed himself as the promised one. The color red communicates the motif of strength-strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.


There is no question that red is a compelling festive color. Consequently, it serves well as the traditional color for the heroic martyrs of the church. The *Lutheran Service Book* church year calendar provides propers for sixteen martyr festivals and recommends red as the appropriate color. Their red blood shed in defense of the Gospel offers perpetual encouragement for God's people to be resolute in living the faith.

Additional uses of red are Reformation Sunday; Holy Cross Day (Sept. 14); on such festive occasions as dedications, anniversaries of a congregation and its physical structure; festive days celebrating the office of the public ministry, such as ordination and installation.


<u>White</u> is the color of purity and completeness. The theme for the "great fifty days" of Easter is supported by the use of white. This color, used primarily during these Sundays, assists in bearing the message that "though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow." Christ's triumph from the grave on Resurrection day is the cause for our rejoicing. His purity before his Father becomes our purity. White reinforces that message of joy.

In addition to its use during Eastertide, white is the appointed color for such festive Sundays as Christmas and its twelve days; Epiphany (Jan. 6) and the first Sunday following it, observed as the Baptism of Our Lord; the Last Sunday after the Epiphany, also known as Transfiguration Sunday; Holy Trinity Sunday; and twenty-one minor festivals and occasions listed on the church year calendar in *Lutheran Service Book*. In all, white serves as the best festive color for the church year.




Our Church Library


