Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter the month of November, there's a lot we have to think about on the horizon. We begin the month celebrating All Saints' Day. Thanksgiving is coming up. The end of the church year is approaching and I imagine some of you are already thinking about Christmas. With all this in mind, I encourage you today to think for a bit about who we are.

In our epistle reading for All Saints' Day, we hear from 1 John

3, "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is." 1 John 3:2 John reminds us who we are. We are God's children, and as God's children we worship together. We look forward to Christ's return together. Throughout this month we are presented with different opportunities to live out our lives as God's beloved children.

On All Saints' Day, we comfort one another with the hope of eternal life we all have as God's holy saints. As we mourn the loss of those saints who have gone before us and now rest from their labors, we also look forward in hope to the joyful reunion God has promised us as His beloved children. All because of who we are, and who they were who have gone before us.

We gather later this month to give thanks to God for His many blessings to us as His children. Throughout the Scriptures, God calls on us to give thanks. He provides for us as Luther states in the small catechism: "He also gives me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I have. He richly and daily provides me with all that I need to support this body and life." SC; The First Article God provides us with all we have and for this we give Him our thanks and praise. Or as we sing in one of our offertory songs, "We give You but Your own." That is to say to God, "You've given us all we have, and so all we can do is give back to You what is already Yours." And so, what do we have left that is ours to give Him? Our thanks. And so, we hear repeated throughout the scriptures: "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever!" 1 Chr. 16:34 His love endures forever! That love He has shown us in Christ, who gave His own life for us, which brings us to our third thing to look forward to in November.

As this month comes to a close, we look to the season of Advent. Throughout the season of Advent, we prepare to celebrate the coming of Christ for us. We remember all the promises God has made to us throughout the scriptures about His Son, Jesus and looking forward to the fulfillment of those promises both at Christmas, and in the age to come when Christ returns in glory.

So, as God's holy saints, as His beloved children, let us rejoice together. Let us give thanks together. Let us anticipate together and encourage one another with God's words of hope, comfort, peace, and joy.

In His Service, Pastor Nathan Peitsch <u>White</u> is the color of purity and completeness. The theme for the "great fifty days" of Easter is supported by the use of white. This color, used primarily during these Sundays, assists in bearing the message that "though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow." Christ's triumph from the grave on Resurrection day is the cause for our rejoicing. His purity before his Father becomes our purity. White reinforces that message of joy.


In addition to its use during Eastertide, white is the appointed color for such festive Sundays as Christmas and its twelve days; Epiphany (Jan. 6) and the first Sunday following it, observed as the Baptism of Our Lord; the Last Sunday after the Epiphany, also known as Transfiguration Sunday; Holy Trinity Sunday; and twenty-one minor festivals and occasions listed on the church year calendar in *Lutheran Service Book*. In all, white serves as the best festive color for the church year.


Green, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year. Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!

Epiphany's message of Christ's revelation to the Gentiles along with the season's traditional emphasis on extending Christ's kingdom through missions, calls for the use of green-the color symbolic of growth.



QUILT DEDICATION

St. Matthew quilt dedication was held on Sunday, October 1 during our church service. Quilts were displayed on the pews. A total of 272 quilts were made this year. 6 went to Lifehouse Ranch (addiction rehab) in Wilton, IA. 5 quilts were sold, 11 was a fire quilt and 1 was a benefit auction quilt. We saved 3 in case there is a need for them. The rest were taken to the Orphan Grain Train in Ida Grove to be shipped wherever there is a humanitarian need. We have had several donations of fabric and have picked up used sheets from3 motels (used them for liners). We have had several newcomers to our group and enjoy working together to make blankets for the needy. 
