Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As I'm sure you by now have heard, our two congregations, St Paul's and St Mathew's are embarking on a new journey. As a solution to the vacancy at St Matthew's, District has helped to connect us up with the SMP (Specific Ministry Pastor) Program, through Concordia Seminary in St Louis. We are pleased to welcome John Stacy on board as he prepares to enter this program and work with us over the next several years to become a pastor.

The SMP program has been around in our church body for some time now. It is a four year distance learning program for training up men

for specific ministry situations. John is beginning his time with us as a "Parish Assistant". In this role he will be helping us to get back to a more "normal" worship schedule at St Matthew's. John will be leading our non-communion worship services at both our congregations until such time as he is able to administer the sacrament. As "Parish Assistant" he will be leading the liturgy for our services, and reading a sermon written by one of our local pastors, or in some cases from another LCMS pastor.

Beginning next year, John will officially start the SMP program. At that time he will begin his course work on the road towards becoming an ordained pastor. He will serve as vicar starting at that point and after he has had his first preaching course, he will be able to start writing his own sermons.

During all of this, our churches have agreed that I will serve has John's supervisor and mentor. We will be working together on his sermons, discussing course work, and doing many visitations together as well. This is a great opportunity for our two churches to work together to help bring one more pastor into the LCMS.

With all this in mind, for some time, we will be trading off which of us is serving at our two congregations. We are doing our best to get this information out to all of you so you are aware of the changes that are coming. So first, our communion schedule: Communion will be served on an alternating schedule at our two churches. The first Sunday of the month it will be at St Paul's, the second at St Matthew's, the third at St Paul's, and the fourth at St Matthew's, on the rare fifth Sundays we will serve communion again at St Paul's. This means 1st, 3rd, and 5th Sundays of the month, I will serve at St Paul's and John will serve at St Matthew's. The 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month, we will switch and I will serve at St Matthew's and John will serve at St Paul's.

This is a temporary change for our two congregations until such time as John is able to administer the Lord's Supper. Officially he will be ordained as specific pastor for St Matthew's 2 years into his program time. Although, it was indicated to us that he could start serving the sacrament before this time. We will keep you informed as to the plan and any questions or concerns you have about these arrangements can be addressed to myself or any of our elders.

As we begin this journey together, I encourage you to recall as St Paul talks to us about the gifts God has given to each of us.

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone." 1Cor. 12:4-6

God equips us each differently to serve Him and His kingdom. What a blessing it is for us to use our gifts and help to encourage God's gifts in another as he prepares to serve our Lord in the pastoral office.

While things may look a little different in our future, we continue to serve the same Lord and learn from His unchanging Word. May God bless our churches as we grow together through this time and may He abundantly bless our new parish assistant and soon to be vicar, John Stacy. In Christ,

<u>Green</u>, Epiphany's message of Christ's revelation to the Gentiles along with the season's traditional emphasis on extending Christ's kingdom through missions, calls for the use of green-the color symbolic of growth.

The Sundays following Pentecost, observed as "the time of the church," share a somewhat similar theme as that of Epiphany. Affectionately called the season of the "green meadow," no doubt due to the fact of green being the established color, these Sundays also emphasize the subject of growth.

Red

Finally, red completes the acronym, "Bg-Bgs-Pwr." Red is a power color and is appropriate for use on Pentecost Sunday. On this day we remember the power and fire of "the Lord and Giver of Life," who revealed himself as the promised one. The color red communicates the motif of strength-strength and power the Holy Spirit gives in order for God's people to call on the name of Jesus Christ and share that powerful name with others.



MY FAVORITE RECIPE

CHOCOLATE CHUNK-STREUSEL COFFEE CAKE

SUBMITTED BY: Janeal Holmes

PREHEAT oven to 350*

servings 24

2/3 c flour

1/2 c firmly packed brown sugar

1/4 c (1/2 stick) cold butter

1 c chopped Planters Slivered Almonds

1 pkg. (2-layer size) yellow cake mix

Brewed strong Maxwell house Coffee (any variety), cooled

1-1/2 pkg. (4oz. Each) Baker's Semi-Sweet Chocolate (6oz.), chopped



Mix flour and sugar in medium bowl. Cut in butter with pastry blender or two knives until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in almonds.

Prepare cake batter as directed on package, substituting the brewed coffee for the water. Pour into greased 15x10x1 inch baking pan; sprinkle with half of the chocolate. Top with almond mixture and remaining chocolate.

Bake 20-25 min. or until wooden toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Cool completely. Cover and store at room temperature.
