# Transfiguration Sunday 27 February 2022

St. Matthew Lutheran Church, Mapleton, IA
Deuteronomy 34:1–12 / Psalm 99 / Hebrews 3:1–6 / Luke 9:28–36

Sermon Title: Jesus transfigured "...to fulfill all righteousness." Sermon Text: Luke 9:28-36

"Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ." (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

Today is Transfiguration Sunday. It is the last Sunday of the Epiphany Season, which started back on January 6. This means that this coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday which begins the Lenten Season.

Transfiguration Sunday highlights one of two big events in the life of Jesus. The first event we celebrated at the beginning of the Epiphany Season, and that is the Baptism of Jesus. Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River by John in order "...to fulfill all righteousness."

"Jesus submitted to John's Baptism the same that sinners were undergoing, in order to affirm His identity with sinners and to provide them with perfect righteousness (2 Co 5:21)." (Lutheran Study Bible footnote for Matt. 3:15, p. 1582)

The second big event we celebrate today at the end of the Epiphany Season—Jesus being transfigured before three of his disciples. Our Gospel lesson from Luke chapter nine tells us what happened:

"28 Now about eight days after [Jesus was teaching] he took with him Peter and John and James and went up on the mountain to pray. 29 And as he was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white. 30 And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, 31 who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. 32 Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. 33 And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. 34 As he was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. 35 And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!' And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen." (Luke 9:28-36)

At the beginning of the Epiphany Season, we celebrated Jesus' baptism, and today we celebrate his transfiguration before three of his disciples. At both events, we see all three persons of the Trinity. That would have been an amazing and wonderful experience.

The second awesome thing that happened was that while Jesus and his sleepy disciples were up on that mountain, suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared and started talking to Jesus. That would have been another surprising and amazing experience.

But the topic of the conversation that Jesus was having with Moses and Elijah is key to our text for today. "And behold, two men were talking with him, Moses and Elijah, <sup>31</sup> who appeared in glory and spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem." Moses and Elijah are talking with Jesus about his impending crucifixion and resurrection.

When people hear about Jesus and about Jesus dying, it can be a conundrum. Some people might truly believe in Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Some people might wonder if Jesus really died on a cross. These are questions that have caused some people to swerve from the true faith found in Jesus Christ as the Son of God Most High.

A couple of Sundays ago we talked about how important the resurrection of the dead is. If there is no resurrection of the dead, and then Jesus didn't die, then we will all perish in the absence of God. Of course, Paul goes on in this debate that the Scriptures clearly teach that there is a resurrection of the dead, and that Jesus really did die on a cross over two thousand years ago.

And our lesson today points out that the Old Testament Scriptures clearly teach us God the Father's plan of saving all of us from going to hell. This plan included God the Father sending his one and only begotten Son, Jesus, to live among us, and then to die for us, so that no one has to go to hell when he or she dies.

This is what Moses and Elijah were talking with Jesus about: "...his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem." Of course, you might wonder, why were these two specific men standing and talking with Jesus and his disciples? Why Moses and Elijah? Moses represents the Law, and Elijah represents ALL prophets throughout the entire Old Testament Scriptures.

Jesus and three of his disciples—Peter, John and James—were on the top of a mountain, and while they were there, Jesus' clothing became dazzling white. And while Jesus was glowing brightly, Moses and Elijah appeared and started talking to him. What were they talking to Jesus about? They "...spoke of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem."

Jesus' departure? Moses and Elijah were talking to Jesus about Jesus' impending crucifixion and resurrection, which the entire Old Testament teaches. Moses and Elijah were simply talking about what the Bible says is going to happen to Jesus.

<sup>32</sup> Now Peter and those who were with him were heavy with sleep, but when they became fully awake they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. <sup>33</sup> And as the men were parting from him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said." (Luke 9:32-33)

Jesus had been praying, maybe a long time which is why the three disciples fell asleep. But they were quickly awakened by the events that were happening right in front of them. They wake up and see Jesus bright and shining—probably much like he was when he was in heaven. Then those three disciples see two other Old Testament prophets—Moses and Elijah—talking to Jesus about the Scriptures teach about Jesus' upcoming crucifixion for the sins of the whole world.

That would have been quite a lot to experience at that time. And yet, one more awesome thing happened right after this. <sup>34</sup> As [Peter] was saying these things, a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. <sup>35</sup> And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!' <sup>36</sup> And when the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and told no one in those days anything of what they had seen." (Luke 9:28-36)

Immediately the Trinity appears—in a cloud on the mountain top. In the Old Testament when a cloud appears, then God himself often appears. When Moses set up the tabernacle in the desert for the Israelites to worship God, God would appear in a cloud over the tabernacle. We see this the Book of Numbers:

"On the day that the tabernacle was set up, the cloud covered the tabernacle, the tent of the testimony. And at evening it was over the tabernacle like the appearance of fire until morning. So it was always: the cloud covered it by day and the appearance of fire by night." (Numbers 9:15-16)

So here on the mountain, Jesus is standing with his three disciples, and then suddenly a cloud appears. "...a cloud came and overshadowed them, and they were afraid as they entered the cloud. <sup>35</sup> And a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen One; listen to him!'

As I said earlier, at Jesus' baptism, the Trinity also appeared to Jesus, John and everyone, who was waiting to be baptized by John on the edge of the Jordan River. "And when Jesus was baptized, immediately he went up from the water, and behold, the heavens were opened to him, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and coming to rest on him; and behold, a voice from heaven said, 'This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased." (Matthew 3:16-17)

We start the Epiphany season looking at Jesus' baptism. And now at the end of this Epiphany Season, Jesus gets transfigured—his clothing becomes dazzling white—and the Trinity also appears on a mountain top.

Both times that the Trinity is revealed is another reminder that everything that is written in the Bible is true. "For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope." (Romans 15:4)

The Bible teaches us all kinds of things—and all things point us to Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith. When we read or listen to God's Word every day, then you are able to grow more in the grace and knowledge of what Jesus has done for you—dying on a cross to give you eternal life. Praise the Lord oh my soul. Praise all his benefits to me. To God be the glory now and forever. Amen.

The peace of God which transcends all understanding guard and keep your hearts in Christ Jesus. Amen.



# Witnesses to Christ: People from His Passion

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus three times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by seven demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for thirty pieces of silver).
