

Deuteronomy 26:1–11 / Psalm 91:1–13 / Romans 10:8b–13 / Luke 4:1–13

Sermon Title: The Truth is Written in God's Word Sermon Text: Luke 4:1-13

"Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ." (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

Last Sunday was Transfiguration Sunday. Transfiguration Sunday marked the end of the Epiphany Season. Transfiguration Sunday marked the time when Jesus "...was praying, the appearance of his face was altered, and his clothing became dazzling white." (Luke 9:29)

Now, today, we see Jesus engaged in another spiritually-charged situation. "And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness ² for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry. The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, ''Man shall not live by bread alone.'''

"And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, 'To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."

"And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you," and "On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone." And Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time." (Luke 4:1-13)

Here Jesus is enduring a lot! First, the Holy Spirit prompts Jesus to go out into the desert where he stayed for forty days. During those forty days, Jesus prayed and possibly meditated on God and His Holy Word. Scripture also tells us that during those forty days, Jesus was tempted by the devil to use his divine power for selfish purposes.

Jesus was in the wilderness "for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry." It's understandable that after fasting for forty days, Jesus was hungry, and it was at this human point that the devil begins tempting and taunting Jesus.

The devil saw that Jesus was hungry. He had been fasting and praying for forty days in the wilderness. So, the devil jumps right in to see if Jesus will bow to the devil's whims, and if Jesus will use his divine power to help himself. "The devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone.""

Even though Jesus is probably really hungry, he sees right through the devil. Jesus doesn't give up and bow to the devil's whims to magically change a rock into bread. This is what the devil wanted hungry Jesus to do. Instead of turning a rock into bread, Jesus uses Scripture to respond to the devil. "And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "Man shall not live by bread alone." In this response, Jesus quotes a passage from Deuteronomy chapter 8 verse 3 in which Moses wanted the Israelites to remember that everything they have comes from God.

When you are really hungry and need food RIGHT NOW, do you make good decisions? Probably not. Back in Genesis chapter 25, Jacob swindled his brother, Esau, and got Esau to give up his birthright as the first-born son.

The story goes that Esau had been out hunting and returned home exhausted. Jacob had just cooked some delicious-smelling stew, but Jacob wouldn't give his brother any food until Esau gave up his birthright as the first-born son. Esau was exhausted and made a poor choice, and gave up his birthright as the first-born son—all for a bowl of stew.

Making poor choices when you're really hungry—or when you're really angry—or when you're really hurting—often makes you regret what you said or did in the heat of the moment. This is why it's better to fill up with the Word of God, and then at least you'll have some foundational material to work with in the heat of the moment.

When the devil sees that tempting Jesus to turn a rock into bread didn't work, the devil tries another tactic. "And the devil took [Jesus] up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, 'To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours.' And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."

The devil is trying to get Jesus to give in and use his divine power for a magic show for the devil. Jesus won't have any of it. The devil claims: "To you I will give all this authority and their glory (of all the kingdoms of the world), for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will."

First of all, the devil talks to Jesus like the devil truly has all authority over every kingdom of this world. This is false. From Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells us: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me." (Matthew 28:18) And from First Corinthians chapter 15: "For God has put all things in subjection under [Jesus'] feet." (1 Corinthians 15:27)

And just like last time, when the devil tried to temp Jesus to turn a rock into bread, here this second time Jesus responds to the devil with Scripture. "And Jesus answered him, 'It is written, "You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve."

Here Jesus is quoting from Deuteronomy chapter 6 verse 13 in which Moses is encouraging the Israelites to focus their entire lives on the One True God: "Hear, O Israel,: The Lord our God, the Lord is one, You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might." (Deut. 6:4-5)

Jesus reminds the devil with Scripture the importance of following the First Commandment: "You shall have no other gods before me." And the Small Catechism explains this further: "We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things." When Jesus reminds the devil that there is only one God, who is to be worshiped, Jesus again is using Scripture to make his point. This is the second time that Jesus uses Scripture to teach the truth which is contrary to what the devil is doing to Jesus.

The devil uses similar tactics to confuse and frustrate you and me and all believers. And yet, in the midst of being hungry, frustrated or angry, it is very possible with the help of God Almighty to make good, God-pleasing choices throughout the day. This is why it's important to know what the truth of God's Word is. Memorize portions of Scripture to keep those nuggets of truth in your heart and mind. When you know what the truth really

is, then you won't be swayed by the devil or anyone else telling you stuff that isn't from God.

A third time, the devil tries again to see if he can get Jesus to act contrary to God's Word. "And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here, for it is written, "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you," and "On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone."' And Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test."""

Here we see the devil trying a third time to try and get Jesus to use his divine powers for selfish purposes. The devil is always uses a variety of tactics and sneaky paths to get you, me, Jesus and all believers to turn away from believing in the truth and instead believe a lie. The first time that the devil tempted Jesus was after Jesus has been praying and fasting for forty days. The devil tried to get Jesus to turn a rock into bread, because the devil knew that Jesus—who is fully God and fully man—was really hungry. Instead, Jesus answered the devil with a nugget of truth from God's Word that everything we have comes from God.

Then, the devil tried to make Jesus think that the devil was in charge of every kingdom on this planet, and if Jesus will just bow down and worship the devil, then the devil would allow Jesus to be in charge of every kingdom on this planet.

First of all, the devil is NOT in charge of any kingdom in this world. Jesus has complete authority over EVERYTHING and EVERYONE on this planet. The devil simply wants to get the hungry Jesus to act contrary to what the Bible teaches us about God.

Now, this third time, the devil is trying to get Jesus to jump off the highest point of the temple in Jerusalem. This time the devil even quotes part of Psalm 91. The devil does quote a part of Scripture, but the devil uses this part of Scripture to prove his twisted point.

The devil wants Jesus to jump off the highest point of the temple in Jerusalem, because Psalm 91 clearly says that if Jesus jumps off the highest point of the temple, then God the Father will instruct his angels to catch Jesus and keep him from breaking any bones. Of course, if Jesus jumped off the temple, that would be completely contrary to his nature. Jesus gives us examples to follow—examples that will glorify God and will help us grown in our faith.

And just as Jesus did in the previous two situations, Jesus quotes Scripture that actually teaches about this situation. Jesus doesn't quote a Bible passage to try and make his point even if the Bible passage talks about the situation. *And Jesus answered him, 'It is said, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test."*

Here Jesus is quoting from Deuteronomy chapter six verse 16 in which Moses reminds the Israelites that they are to simply TRUST God completely, and to not put God to the test as though God has to prove something to them.

And then at the end of these three tests, our text tells us: "And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him until an opportune time." For the moment, the devil was done trying to tempt Jesus to act contrary to his nature. Our text tells us that the devil "...departed from him until an opportune time."

The devil is constantly trying to get us to turn away from Jesus and to look at everything else in this world. In case we're not sure if the devil is constantly on our heels, we "...should look around to see whether [we are] still in the world, and remember that there will be no lack of sin and trouble, as the Scriptures [teach us.]" Also, [we] "...will certainly have the devil also around [us], who with his lying and murdering day and night will let [us] have no peace, within or without, as the Scriptures picture him." (Small Catechism: Christian Q's & A's #20)

This is why it's so important to know the truth from God's Word. Read or listen to the Bible every day. Then after you've read or listened to a portion, pray and ask God to help you understand that particular passage better. Jesus countered false teaching with ONLY the truth from God's Word. Let's follow his example in our daily lives. This is all possible by the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Amen.

The peace of God which transcends all understanding guard and keep your hearts in Christ Jesus. Amen.
