Ezekiel 33:7–20 / Psalm 85 / 1 Corinthians 10:1–13 / Luke 13:1–9

Sermon Title: The Bible was written for our Instruction and Learning

Sermon Text: 1 Corinthians 10:1-13

“Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ.” (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

Today we’re going to look at our Epistle lesson from First Corinthians chapter 10. In this section of Paul’s letter, he writes to encourage, to discipline and to teach the fellow Christians in Corinth. Paul wrote most of his letters to fellow believers in Jesus—not to unbelievers. When Paul wrote to discipline his readers, he does so because he cares deeply for them.

If you get a text, an email or a card that talks about how you need to change your ways, or how you should have said or done something differently at a meeting, the text or email can come off sounding badly. You might even get bristly. And reading Paul’s letters, you can get offended and bristly, but Paul truly cares about his fellow Christians at Corinth—and he cares about us, too.

Paul also uses his letter to teach his fellow Christians the truth from God’s Word—which at that time was only the Old Testament. Paul quotes often from the Old Testament to remind his readers of what Moses and the Old Testament prophets preached about Jesus in the past.

In our text today, Paul reminds his fellow Christians of their spiritual ancestors, and how God led them and guided them in the way that He wanted them to go. *“For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea,² and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea,³ and all ate the same spiritual food,⁴ and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.* (1 Corinthians 10:1-4)

Paul reminds his fellow Christians at Corinth—and us—that our spiritual ancestors were led by Moses in the Desert of Sin. Back in Numbers chapter 13, we see how God led the Israelites through the desert: *“²¹ And the LORD went before them by day in a pillar of cloud to lead them along the way, and by night in a pillar of fire to give them light, that they might travel by day and by night. ²² The pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night did not depart from before the people.”* (Numbers 13:21-22)

Paul talks about how God led our spiritual ancestors through the desert by a cloud during the day and by a pillar of fire by night. Paul also points out that our spiritual ancestors *“...passed through the sea.”* We see this event back in Numbers chapter 14:

“²¹ Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and the LORD drove the sea back by a strong east wind all night and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided. ²² And the people of Israel went into the midst of the sea on dry ground, the waters being a wall to them on their right hand and on their left.” (Numbers 14:21-22)

So, Paul points out that our spiritual ancestors were led through the desert by a cloud during the day, and a pillar of fire by night. And that cloud led them through the Red Sea on dry ground.

The Israelites walking through the Red Sea was “a metaphor for the Israelites who passed through the waters of the Red Sea and emerged a new people, saved from slavery.” (Lutheran Study Bible, p. 1959, note on 1 Cor. 10:2)

Then Paul reminds the Christians at Corinth that the Israelites “...*all ate the same spiritual food,⁴ and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.*”

We see back in Exodus chapter 16 how God fed the Israelites with manna—bread from heaven—every day for forty years, and how in Exodus chapter 17 God gave the Israelites water from a rock to drink every day. The rock that gave them water to drink every day was Christ Jesus.

God gave the Israelites water to drink every day in spite of the fact that they grumbled and complained to God about many things. God, in his grace and mercy and love for the Israelites—and for us—gave them what they needed in spite of their ungratefulness.

Paul picks up this topic next in our text: ⁵*Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.* ⁶*Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did.* ⁷*Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, ‘The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play.’* ⁸*We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day.* ⁹*We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents,* ¹⁰*nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer.”* (1 Corinthians 10:5-10)

After Paul reminds his fellow believers in Corinth about how God brought the Israelites safely out of slavery in Egypt, and how God provided bread and water every day for forty years while the Israelites traveled around the Desert of Sin.

Now, Paul points out some of the bad things that their spiritual ancestors did, and thereby sinned against God and against one another. ⁶*Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did.* ⁷*Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, ‘The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play.’* ⁸*We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day.”*

Here Paul reminds the believers in Corinth how the Israelites got led astray by their neighbors and forced Aaron, the priest and brother of Moses, to build golden calf so that they could worship that idol as though that idol was the One True God. And this is what Scripture tells us happened. Aaron built a golden calf, and then they worshipped it with dancing and singing and sexual immorality.

Then, Paul reminds the Israelites of how some of his ancestors had tested God and God sent serpents among them and some of them died. ⁹*We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents,* ¹⁰*nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer.”*

Here Paul is talking about a situation in Exodus chapter fourteen in which the Israelites rebelled against Moses and Aaron and in turn rebelled against God. At this point in Exodus, God told Moses to tell the Israelites to send a search party into the Land of Canaan. The search party included twelve men—one man from each tribe of Israel—and they were to scout out the land.

When the search party returned, ten of the men gave a report that basically said they could not possibly fight against the people living in Canaan—even though God told them to go. The ten men got the rest of the Israelites frustrated and convinced that they could not go fight even though two last

two men in the search party—Joshua and Caleb—tried to get the Israelites to see that God was still on their side and that they could fight their enemies and win, because of God.

After this situation, God told the Israelites that everyone twenty years old and older would die in the desert and would not enter the Promised Land. This was a situation in which God told the Israelites to do something difficult, and they rebelled against Moses and Aaron and God, and God punished them.

Then, Paul goes on to share that all these events were written down for us as examples of how God works in and through our lives. ¹¹ *Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.* ¹² *Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.* ¹³ *No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.*” (1 Corinthians 10:11-13)

Paul tells us why all the stuff was written in the Bible—to teach us—to remind us—to show us how to live according to God’s Word. *“Now these things happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.”*

God made sure that the many different events throughout history—some events that seemed to be mundane and unimportant, and some events that are astronomical and way too amazing. All the events that were written in the Bible were to show us how God interacted with the people in the past—and how God continues to interact with us today.

All these things are written in the Bible to show us what happened in the past, and how God responded in order that we might learn from those situations. When we see how God interacted with different people in the past, then we can learn from those situations.

¹² *Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.* ¹³ *No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.”*

Paul points out that if a person seems to think that he is got it all together and doesn’t need God, that person should be aware that God might allow something bad to happen to him in order to teach him to seek the Lord while he may be found, and to call upon Jesus while he is near.

God tempts no one, but God allows all kinds of things to happen to us in order to get our attention, and to get us to refocus on Jesus, who is the author and perfecter of our faith. When you think we’ve got it all together, and you feel pretty confident and secure, that’s when you should be more aware of your daily life. That’s when God could allow something to happen to you to shake you up and get you a little rattled so that you stop being confident in yourself and to return your confidence in God alone.

¹² *Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall.* ¹³ *No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.”*

Even though God allows all kinds of temptations and tests in your life, God does so to teach

you—just as God taught believers centuries ago. But Paul offers some encouragement about temptations and tests—that God “...will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.”

God will allow all kinds of temptations and tests to come into your life in order to get you to remember what Moses taught the Israelites: “*Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might.*” (Deuteronomy 6:4-5)

When we trust God completely, then it doesn't matter what happens. When we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus all the time, then it doesn't matter what temptations and tests come our way, because God will give us the strength to get through that difficult time.

Yes, you heard correctly. God will allow temptations and tests to come to you and me and all people, and God will also give you and me and all people the strength and stamina to get through that temptation and test. God “...will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.”

This is another example of how God works in and through our lives. God provides for all our needs of body and soul. God helps us get through difficult situations which he may have allowed to come to us in order to teach us to trust him 100 percent of the time.

God loves you and me and all people more than you can ever imagine, and he wants you and me and all people to be with him for all eternity. This is why God encourages us with the promises written down for our learning and instruction so that we can learn from what believers in the past had to experience. Seek the Lord while he may be found. Call upon Jesus while he is near. To God be the glory now and forever. Amen.





5. Fear. Love. Trust. What do the words mean for your life as you live in Christ’s forgiveness?




