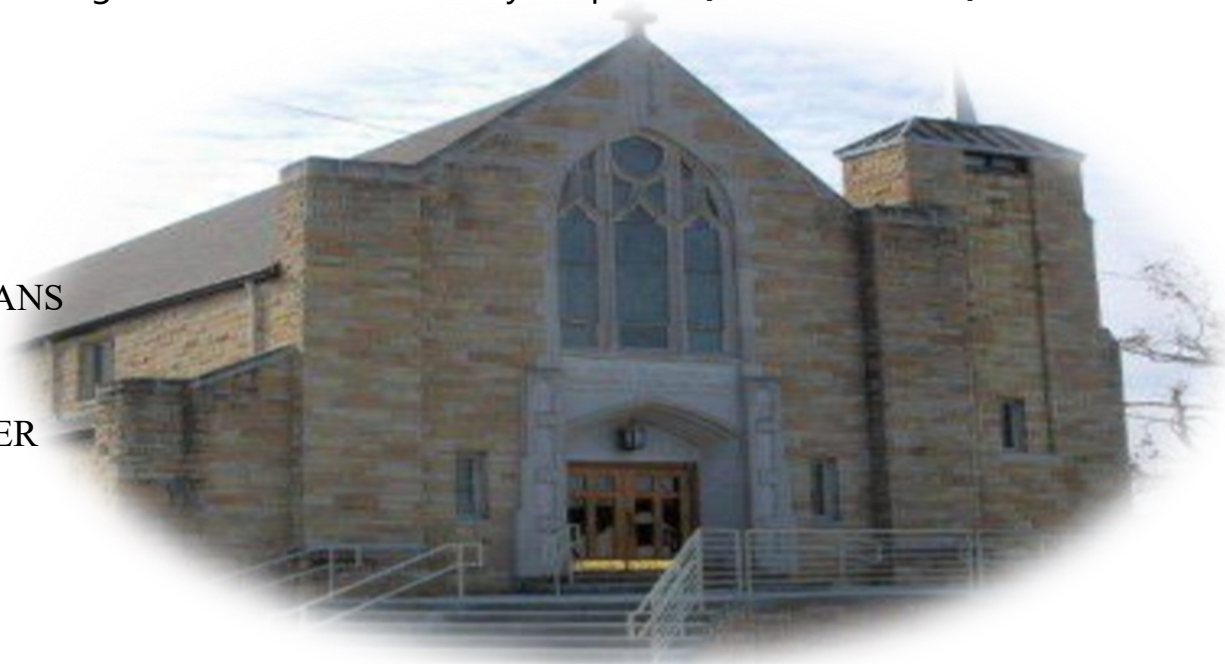

Isaiah 12:1–6 / Psalm 32 / 2 Corinthians 5:16–21 / Luke 15:1–3, 11–32

Sermon Title: *“if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation”*

Sermon Text: 2 Corinthians 5:16-21

“Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ.” (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

When you confess your sins, you are simply acknowledging what you have said or did against God and someone else, so that you can then see God’s grace even clearer. When you confess your sins, God forgives you of your sins. God then shows you his grace, his mercy, his love for you.

Unfortunately, it doesn’t seem to be that easy. Admitting that you have said or done something against God and someone else is not what you usually want to do. We’d rather hold inside that wrong we’ve said or done and try to hide from any accusing stares.

But I can tell you from personal experience that *“If we confess our sins, [God] is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”* (1 John 1:9) In the past, I have asked another pastor if I could go through Confession and Absolution with him, and he would gladly lead me through that short service.

And after the pastor pronounced God’s gracious forgiveness, I almost always felt like a huge weight had been lifted from my chest and shoulders. Receiving God’s forgiveness made me feel like a million bucks.

In some sense, Paul is saying you experience the same thing after Jesus dies and gives you new life. *“¹⁶ From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.”* (2 Corinthians 5:16-17)

Contrary to what people think today—both Christians and non-Christians—there is no amount of “doing good” that can make you a “good person.” Of course, if you get rid of Jesus, then none of this church stuff matters, and we should all go home, and eat, drink and be merry for tomorrow we die.

But Jesus is as real as you and me. This is what Christians in centuries past have confessed and believed, and wrote down in the Athanasian Creed:

“28. Therefore, it is the right faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at the same time both God and man. 29. He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages; and He is man, born from the substance of His mother in this age: 30. Perfect God and perfect man, composed of a rational soul and human flesh; 31. equal to the Father with respect to His divinity, less than the Father with respect to His humanity. 32. Although He is God and man, He is not two, but one Christ: 33. One, however, not by the conversion of the divinity into

flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God; 34. one altogether, not by confusion of substance, but by unity of person.”

It is this Jesus—this God-man—who is the core of our faith. This is the faith that has been passed down through the centuries, and written down for our learning and instruction. The Athanasian Creed continues:

“35. For as the rational soul and flesh is one man, so God and man is one Christ, 36. Who suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose again the third day from the dead, 37. Ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father, God Almighty, from whence He will come to judge the living and the dead.”

Jesus did this, because he loves you, me and all people. Jesus became a man like you and me in order to live exactly as you and I live. Jesus became a man in order to fulfill the Law of Moses given by God our Heavenly Father. The Law of Moses says that you have to do exactly what God asks of you.

From the Prophet Ezekiel: *“Behold, all souls are mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is mine: the soul who sins shall die.”* (Ezekiel 18:4) From James: *“For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it.”* (James 2:10) And from Matthew: *“You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.”* (Matthew 5:48)

The Law of Moses is what God expects of us—what we are supposed to do. The only purpose of the Law is to kill and destroy. The Law shows us that we are in a desperate situation and need all the help we can get.

This is how Paul summarizes the Law the Gospel: *“for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus.”* (Romans 3:23-24)

This is why Jesus came to live as you and me and all people. Jesus came to in order to give us opportunity to confess our sins and receive God’s gracious forgiveness. Jesus then died on a cross in order to give you, me and all believers a new life in Christ. *“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.”*

Without Jesus—outside of Jesus—there is no hope. You are only living for today. Without Jesus life is temporary and fleeting. As an example of how temporary and fleeting our lives can be, the Prophet Isaiah compares our lives to grass.

“All flesh is grass, and all its beauty is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades when the breath of the LORD blows on it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever.” (Isaiah 40:6b-8)

Comparing our lives to grass can sound demeaning. Comparing our lives to grass sounds completely contrary to our common thinking that as long as you work hard and pull yourself up by your bootstraps, you’ll succeed.

But that is not how God thinks. God’s ways and thoughts are completely opposite the way you and I think and act. We are made new in the sight of God our Heavenly Father by the life, death and resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We are made new because of what Jesus has done for you *“Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.”* We are new creatures because of the person and work of Jesus Christ. And we are made new creatures, because of how

much God loves you and me and all people.

“¹⁸ All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹ that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.” (2 Corinthians 5:18-19)

God our Heavenly Father reconciled us to himself after our first parents sinned against God and against each other. God our Heavenly Father allowed his one-and-only-begotten Son, Jesus to be the ultimate sacrifice to take away your sins, my sins and the sins of the whole.

This is what John writes in his Gospel: *“For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.”* (John 3:16-17)

God the Father desires to be in relationship with you, with me, and with all people which is why God the Father went to such extremes to reconcile our broken relationship—a relationship that was broken by sin coming into this world. *“...in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.”*

As soon as you realize that you have said or done something against God and against someone else, God says he will forgive you of your sins. That’s it! No questions asked. Confess your sins and then receive God’s gracious forgiveness.

And God tells us in our text from Second Corinthians chapter five that God reconciled us to himself through the person and work of Jesus Christ. Then, God the Father tells us that he gave us the same opportunity to reconcile with others: *“...and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation.”*

God gives us the opportunity to reconcile with other Christians and with non-Christians. After all, God loved you and me and all people while you, me and all people were still sinners in God’s eyes. God then reconciled our broken relationship and restored us—making us whole and holy in his eyes.

Once God reconciled us to himself, he then gave us the “message of reconciliation” so that we can reconcile with others. Now, granted, it might seem easy for God the Father to reconcile with us, but it might be very difficult for you, me and everyone to reconcile with others.

And yet, it is easy—with the help of God Almighty. God gives us his Holy Word—to teach and guide us in the way we should go. God had all kinds of events written down in the Bible for our learning and instruction so that we could know God more.

Trying to reconcile on your own might be hard, but with God all things are possible. How? Pray and ask God to help you to forgive that person, who has hurt you. Pray and ask God to help you to pray for that person. Pray and ask God to bless that person.

It is possible to reconcile with someone else, but it only happens by the work of the Holy Spirit in your life. God the Father loved the world so much that he allowed his one-and-only-begotten Son, Jesus to die for you, to die for me, to die for all people, so that you, me and all people will have eternal life.

“²⁰ Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹ For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.” (2 Corinthians 5:16-21)

Paul concludes this portion of our text for today by encouraging you to seek God. Pray and confess your sins, and then receive God's gracious forgiveness. Pray and ask God to help you to reconcile with someone, who has hurt you.

You are able to do this by the work of the Holy Spirit in you. You are able to do this because God gave you an example to follow. God gave us Jesus so that we can go to heaven when we die. God gave us his grace, his mercy and his love, because he so intently desires to be in relationship with you for all eternity.

Seek the Lord while he may be found. Call upon him while he is near. To God be the glory now and forever. Amen.

The peace of God which transcends all understanding guard and keep your hearts in Christ Jesus. Amen.

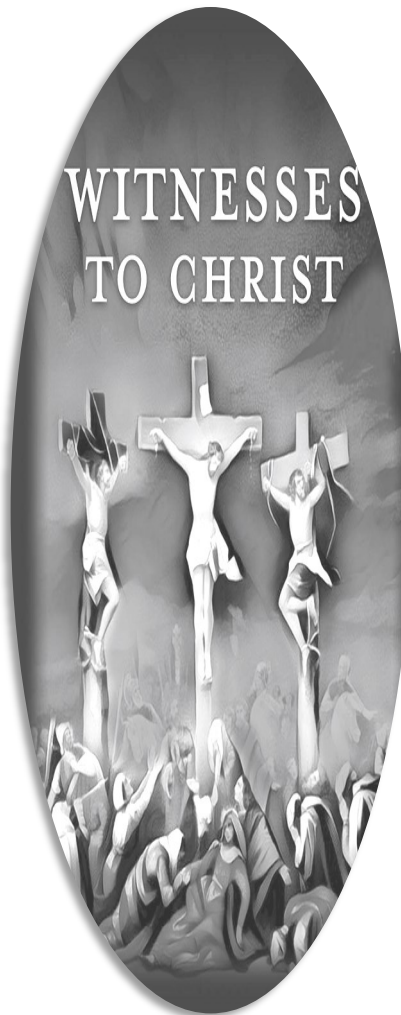

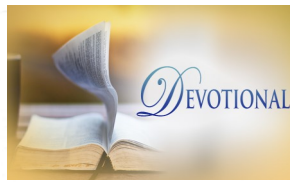

THE SECOND COMMANDMENT

You shall not misuse the name of the Lord your God. (*Exodus 20:7*)

What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not curse, swear, use satanic arts, lie, or deceive by His name, but call upon it in every trouble, pray, praise, and give thanks.

O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth! You have set Your glory above the heavens. (Psalm 8:1)

FOR SHARING

1. "Names are everything," wrote Oscar Wilde. In what ways do names—first, middle, and last names—give us a sense of identity and purpose?
2. How do people misuse God's name today? Why do you think people misuse God's name?
3. From eternity, the name planned for the Messiah was Jesus, Immanuel (Matthew 1:21, 23). What does it mean for you that Jesus was "God with us" at Calvary? What does it mean for your eternal destiny?
4. God's name—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—was placed on us in Baptism (Matthew 28:19). How does His name shape our identity in the world? How does our Baptism into the triune God strengthen us for daily service?
5. Which name for God best reminds you of His goodness to you today?

PRAYER

Gracious God, remind me every day that I am baptized in Your name. Help me to use Your name respectfully and faithfully in all that I say, think, and do. Strengthen me with Your Spirit so that my name as "Christian" will give honor to You. Amen.

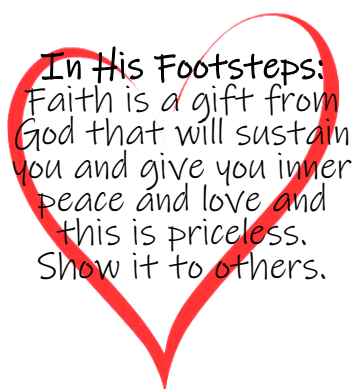
