Isaiah 43:16–21 / Psalm 126 / Phil. 3:4b–14 / Luke 20:9–20

Sermon Title: They Killed the King's Son
Sermon Text: Luke 20:9-20

“Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ.” (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

The people rejected the king's son. They didn't want him. They wanted to do things their own way. So, they took matters into their own hands, and they eventually killed the king's son. It was a terrible thing that happened. And yet, it was God's will that the king's son should die.

This might not make sense, but it's exactly how things went. This is exactly what happened to Jesus, the Son of God Most High—Jesus, the Son of the Everlasting Father—Jesus, who was born in this world to take away the sins of every single person on this planet.

To make this point, Jesus tells a story about a man, who planted a vineyard, and hired other men to work the vineyard, and the things that these workers did after they got on the job: *“⁹ And [Jesus] began to tell the people this parable: ‘A man planted a vineyard and let it out to tenants and went into another country for a long while. ¹⁰ When the time came, he sent a servant to the tenants, so that they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed. ¹¹ And he sent another servant. But they also beat and treated him shamefully, and sent him away empty-handed. ¹² And he sent yet a third. This one also they wounded and cast out.’ (Luke 20:9-12)*

The owner of the vineyard had traveled and left the garden in the care of his hired workers. After the owner returns home, he wants to enjoy some of the grapes and other produce from his garden. So, the owner sends one of his servants to collect some of the grapes and other produce and return the owner's home.

Unfortunately, the servant gets treated badly. *¹⁰ When the time came, he sent a servant to the tenants, so that they would give him some of the fruit of the vineyard. But the tenants beat him and sent him away empty-handed.”* The owner of the vineyard wanted some of the produce from his garden, but workers refused to give the owner's servant anything. Instead, those workers beat the servant and sent him away.

The owner tries a second time: *¹¹ And he sent another servant. But they also beat and treated him shamefully, and sent him away empty-handed.”* I'm sure the owner of the vineyard is getting a little upset and aggravated with the workers in his garden. So, the owner tries a third time: *¹² And he sent yet a third. This one also they wounded and cast out.”*

By now, the owner of the vineyard is probably exasperated, and not sure what to do to get the produce from his vineyard. *¹³ Then the owner of the vineyard said, ‘What shall I do? I will send my beloved son; perhaps they will respect him.’ ¹⁴ But when the tenants saw him, they said to themselves,*

This is the heir. Let us kill him, so that the inheritance may be ours.’¹⁵ And they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them?¹⁶ He will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others. When they heard this, they said, “Surely not!” (Luke 20:13-16)

Jesus is telling this story to make a point about his own purpose in life. Jesus knows that many fellow Israelites don’t know or believe that he is who the Scriptures say he is. The Pharisees and other religious leaders don’t like him.

Even though many people don’t know who he is, or don’t believe that he is the Messiah promised all throughout the Old Testament, Jesus IS the one written about in the Scriptures. The people, who Jesus is telling this story to, represent the workers in the vineyard—they don’t care about the Son of the King—that is, they don’t care about Jesus or what he has to say to them.

“Then the owner of the vineyard said, ‘What shall I do? I will send my beloved son; perhaps they will respect him.’¹⁴ But when the tenants saw him, they said to themselves, ‘This is the heir. Let us kill him, so that the inheritance may be ours.’¹⁵ And they threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. What then will the owner of the vineyard do to them?¹⁶ He will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others. When they heard this, they said, “Surely not!” (Luke 20:13-16)

What did that man, who owned this vineyard do badly to his workers that they refuse to give him the produce from his own garden? Why did those workers act so terribly against the owner’s servants that they treated his servants badly? Why did those workers become so filled with rage that when they saw the owner’s son coming to collect some of the produce, those workers killed the owner’s son?

Jesus then goes on with his story to stress his point that the owner of the vineyard *“...will come and destroy those tenants and give the vineyard to others. When they heard this, they said, ‘Surely not!’¹⁷ But he looked directly at them and said, “What then is this that is written: ‘The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone’?¹⁸ Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him.¹⁹ The scribes and the chief priests sought to lay hands on him at that very hour, for they perceived that he had told this parable against them, but they feared the people.” (Luke 20:16-19)*

Jesus is accusing the Pharisees and other religious leaders, who he’s talking to, about how they have rejected him and want nothing to do with him. These Pharisees and other religious leaders—of all people—should know that what was written in the Old Testament about Jesus has been fulfilled in Jesus standing there in front of them.

But they don’t believe in Jesus. They have rejected Jesus, and this is exactly what Jesus is saying here when he quotes and talks about a verse from Psalm 118: *“But [Jesus] looked directly at them and said, “What then is this that is written: ‘The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone’?¹⁸ Everyone who falls on that stone will be broken to pieces, and when it falls on anyone, it will crush him.”*

Here the image is of a stone that someone trips and stumbles over. But Jesus points out that sometimes that same stone which caused some people to stumble and fall, could also be the downfall and seriously injure someone. “All who rejected Christ will feel its sharpness and pain.” (Lutheran Study Bible note p. 1758 for Luke 20:18)

“What then is this that is written: ‘The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone’?” When masons are constructing a building, they sometimes reject some stones over others as

they lay the foundation. This is what has happened to Jesus.

The Pharisees and other religious leaders rejected Jesus, because they didn't believe what the Old Testament taught them—that the Messiah would be born of a virgin, and that the Messiah would come into this world to save everyone from going to hell when he or she dies.

They rejected him, because he did not fit into their mold—into their image of who the promised Messiah in the Old Testament should be. And sadly, there are too many people today, who have fallen for the same lies as these Pharisees and religious leaders.

Too many people today want to live their lives without God, and God does not force anyone to follow him—to be a disciple of Jesus. God gave us free will so that his desire could be fulfilled—that we could CHOOSE to follow him by the work of the Holy Spirit living in each of us.

This is what we confess in the Apostles' Creed: the Third Article and its Meaning: "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen. *What does this mean?* I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith."

God gives every single person on this planet the opportunity to come to him—to repent of their sins and then confess their sins, and then receive God's gracious forgiveness. God gives every single person this opportunity, and you want to confess your sins and receive forgiveness when God the Holy Spirit works faith in you—nurturing that faith and growing your faith.

The Pharisees and other religious leaders didn't believe what the Scriptures taught. Instead, they made up their own ideas about who Jesus is, and their idea was contrary to what God tells us in the Scriptures. This is why Jesus tells this story about the owner of the vineyard trying to get the produce from his garden, and the workers refusing.

Some people refuse to come to Jesus—to believe in Jesus—and they turn away from God. This makes God sad, because God loves ALL people, and desires that all people come to him and be with him for all eternity.

The fact that God loves all people—but hates ALL sin—is why God sent his one-and only-begotten Son, Jesus to save us from going to hell. This is why God sent his Son, Jesus. "*but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*" (Romans 5:8) Amen.

The peace of God which transcends all understanding guard and keep your hearts in Christ Jesus. Amen.

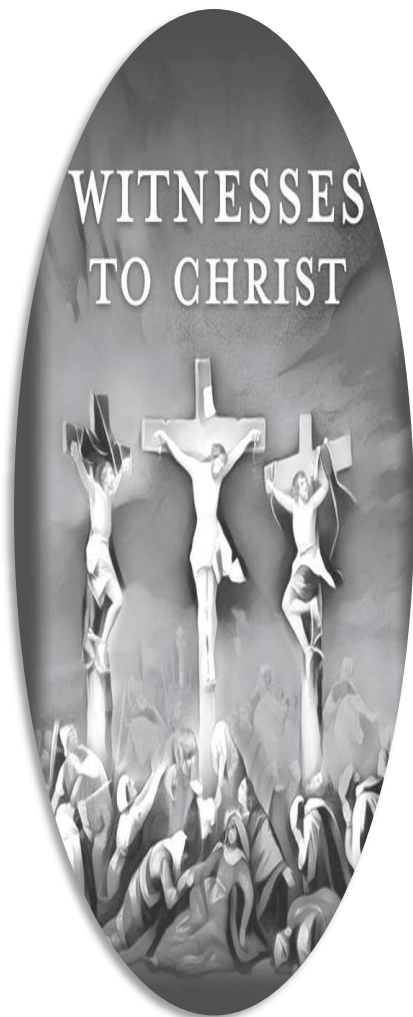

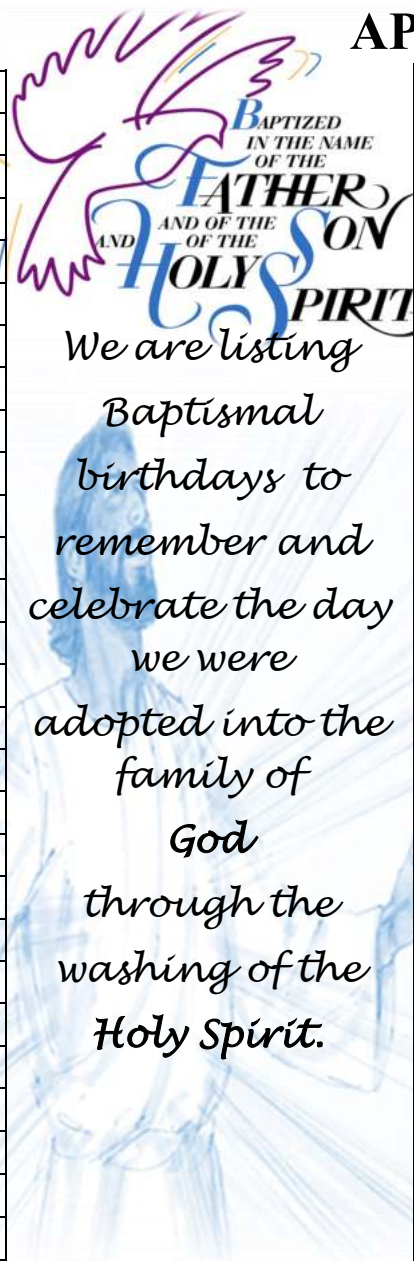
