"Back to the Basics"

A Review of our Christian Faith

11<sup>th</sup> Sunday after Pentecost

8 August 2021

St. Matthew Lutheran Church, Mapleton, IA

1 Kings 19:1-8 / Psalm 34:1-8 / Ephesians 4:17-5:2 / John 6:35-51

Sermon Title: Sacraments: Holy Communion

Sermon Text: 1 Corinthians 10:14-22; 1 Corinthians 11:27-32

"Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father, and our LORD Jesus Christ." (2 Tim. 1:2) Amen.

Today we continue looking at the sacraments. Last Sunday we talked about Holy Baptism, and today we're going to talk about Holy Communion. Holy Communion is one of those key elements in the life of the congregation.

Unfortunately, there are a lot of folks out there, who claim to be Christian, and yet refuse to gather with other believers to receive from God all that he wants to give them. The Book of Concord even tells us that Christians, who refuse to gather with other believers in worship, and who don't hunger or thirst for Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion, should not be considered Christians.

Paul talks a lot in the New Testament about participating in the Body of Christ—using your spiritual gifts to glorify God and to build up the congregation. Paul also talks about participating in the Body of Christ when he talks about eating and drinking of Christ's Body and Blood in Holy Communion.

Of course, Paul talks about the importance of knowing what is going on when Christians gather to receive from God in Holy Communion. <sup>27</sup> Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner"—meaning, the person doesn't understand what the Bible teaches us about Holy Communion. Paul goes on to say that person "will be guilty concerning the body and blood of the Lord [see John 6:51-56] (1 Corinthians 11:27)."

In other words, if you have a vague idea about what Holy Communion is and what's going on, it would be better for you to not eat and drink of Holy Communion until you have had the opportunity to sit down with the pastor to learn more about Holy Communion from the Bible.

Paul continues to offer encouragement to prepare before coming to Holy Communion. "Let a person examine himself, then, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and

drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment on himself. That is why many of you are weak and ill, and some have died." (1 Corinthians 11:27-30)

When Paul wrote his letter, he pointed out that some of the believers, who had gathered for worship and Holy Communion didn't fully understand what the Bible teaches about Holy Communion and that was affecting them negatively. "The same food that should have strengthened their faith instead caused physical harm. The effect of benefit (of eating and drinking of Holy Communion) to one person and curse to another is similar to the way Paul describes the Gospel itself." (Lutheran Study Bible note vs. 30)

In other words, Paul wants you to understand what is happening in Holy Communion and why it is offered to you and what you are receiving by participating in Holy Communion. Martin Luther explains in the Small Catechism: "*What is the Sacrament of the Altar?* It is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine, instituted by Christ Himself for us Christians to eat and to drink."

*"Where is this written?* The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke, and St Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread, and when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: 'Take, eat; this is My body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of Me.' In the same way also He took the cup after supper, and when He had given thanks, He gave it to them, saying, 'Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in My blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me."

When Paul keeps stressing the importance of knowing what is happening and what you are receiving in Holy Communion, he does so, because he reminds us that Jesus tells us that Holy Communion is really important. Holy Communion is not a mid-morning snack after the sermon to keep you satisfied until worship is over. In First Corinthians chapter 10, Paul talks further about what Holy Communion is.

<sup>(16</sup> The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? <sup>17</sup> Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread. <sup>18</sup> Consider the people of Israel: are not those who eat the sacrifices participants in the altar?" (1 Corinthians 10:16-18)

When we eat and drink of Christ's Body and Blood in Holy Communion—as he taught us in the Bible—we are participating in the Body of Christ. Eating and drinking of Holy Communion with other Christians is saying that you are part of this Body of Christ here at St. Matthew Lutheran Church. Participating in Holy Communion is saying that you believe in and support the unity of the Christian faith summarized in all three creeds.

The creeds focus our faith on Jesus, who is the Christ. We talked about how the Athanasian Creed stresses the importance of believing in the unity of the Trinity. When we confess our Christian faith in one of the creeds, we are confessing that we believe the same thing as every other believer here today in regards to what Jesus teaches us in the Bible.

So when we say: "I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic church" we are confessing that we believe in the Christian faith drawn from the Holy Bible. When we make this confession, we are saying that we are united with everyone else here in this building, and everyone else around the world, who confesses the same thing about the Trinity.

This united confession also includes your participation in Holy Communion. Listen again to what Paul says: "<sup>16</sup> The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a participation in the blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a participation in the body of Christ? <sup>17</sup> Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread."

If you don't believe what the Bible teaches us about Holy Communion, then you shouldn't participate in Holy Communion. When you participate in Holy Communion—when eat and drink of Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion, then you say that you believe the same thing as everyone else here.

Of course, you might wonder: how do I know what everyone else here believes? Well, you could go and ask every member here if they believe the same thing about Holy Communion, for example. Or you could simply trust that every Christian, who comes forward to participate in Holy Communion believes what the Bible teaches. And, you yourself can also make sure that you believe what the Scriptures teach about Holy Communion.

This is why our church body stresses Bible teaching and study. This is why we have Confirmation class for our young members. So that the young people can be taught the core truths from God's Word summarized in Luther's Small Catechism. This is why I encourage daily Bible reading or listening so that you can get filled up with Jesus and be equipped to boldly move through each day that God gives you.

When you understand what the Bible teaches about Holy Communion, and you join other people in the congregation, then you are saying that you believe the same thing as these other folks. When you acknowledge that you believe the same thing as these other folks about Holy Communion, you are also saying that you believe in the unity of the Triune God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit. If you need a refresher on what Holy Communion, pull out your Small Catechism, dust it off, and review the questions in the last section of the Small Catechism titled "Christian Questions with their Answers." You can also review the questions in the section titled "The Sacrament of the Altar."

*"What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?* These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation."

This is the main reason that we come forward and eat and drink of Christ's Body and Blood in Holy Communion—to be strengthened in our faith and to be reminded of all that Jesus did for you and for me. "*What is the benefit of this eating and drinking*? These words, "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins," show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation."

In Holy Communion, Jesus forgives us of our sins, and then he reminds us from the Bible what he has done for you and for me. He lived a perfect life to fulfill the Law of Moses, and then he suffered a horrible death so that you and I don't have to suffer that way for our own sins. Then Jesus died and was buried in a tomb, and three days later God the Father raised Jesus back to life so that you and I will also have a new life.

Christ's Body and blood are "Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins." By participating in Holy Communion, God forgives your sins. In this "...Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation."

Where are sins forgiven? Where God's Word is present and spoken. Who receives forgiveness of sins? Anyone, who acknowledges that he or she has said or done something against God and against someone else.

*"Who receives this sacrament worthily?* Fasting and bodily preparation are certainly fine outward training. But that person is truly worthy and well prepared who has faith in these words: 'Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins.' But anyone who does not believe these words or doubts them is unworthy and unprepared, for the words "for you" require all hearts to believe."

Faith is the key. If you believe that the bread and wine offered to you are truly Jesus' Body and Blood—as he teaches us in the Bible—then you are receiving all the benefits that God gives you in Holy Communion. Faith is all that is required to participate in Holy Communion.

That is what Paul and Silas told the group of people in Philippi: "Believe in the Lord Jesus,

*and you will be saved, you and your household.*" (Acts 16:31) Faith in Jesus Christ is what gets you to heaven. Faith in the holy words taught about Holy Communion is how you receive from God all that he wants to give you. To God be the glory now and forever. Amen.

Now, may the peace of God which transcends all understanding guard and keep your hearts in Christ Jesus. Amen.



## Back to the Basics A Review of our Christian Faith June—August 2021

When you read or listen to the Bible every day, then you are regularly equipping yourself with the weapons that you need to live each day according to what God asks of you in His Holy Word.

When you don't read or listen to the Bible every day, then you are simply putting yourself in harms way. Sure, you might think that you've been just fine without God—without reading or listening to the Bible regularly—without eating and drinking of Jesus' Body and Blood in Holy Communion—but you're actually harming yourself spiritually.

If you don't eat food or drink any liquids for some time, then your body and health will start to suffer badly. The same thing happens when you neglect feeding on God's Word.

Also, when you read or listen to the Bible every day, then you start realizing and focusing on the core truths of the Bible—the core things that matter the most—like the two greatest commandments: 1) love God and 2) love your neighbor as yourself.

When you live according to these two greatest commandments, then you will see a different in how you interact with your congregation. Think about this quote from Thom Rainer, who has studied why a lot of churches die, and why a lot of churches thrive:

"When a church dies, there is the predictable prologue of self-centered, self-serving membership. Church members argue about the style of music, the length of the sermon, the types of ministries and programs, and even the type of furniture in the church. Membership becomes about me, myself, and I. In the resuscitate church, the members covenant to put self last. They agree they will not demand their way, but seek to put others first." And then look at what Paul says to the Christians at Philippi: "Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." (Philippians 2:3-4)
