> Maturing in Christ: Called to Discipleship

How does the church grow? It grows by the work of the Holy Spirit working in each of us to tell our neighbors, friends and coworkers about all that Jesus has done in our lives.

This is what we confess in the Apostles' Creed: the Third Article Meaning: "I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith. In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith." (Small Catechism)

Sharing your faith can seem scary or daunting, but it doesn't have to be. After all, it is God the Holy Spirit doing all the work. Your job is simply to follow along and share the hope you have in Jesus when you're given the opportunity.

The church is where God's Name is kept holy and His Word is preached. The Lord's Prayer: the First Petition Meaning explains: "God's name is kept holy when the Word of God is taught in its truth and purity, and we, as the children of God, also lead holy lives according to it. Help us to do this, dear Father in heaven! But anyone who teaches or lives contrary to God's Word profanes the name of God among us. Protect us from this, heavenly Father!"

As the church grows, then so do its members. God has given every member some "spiritual gift" or ability to help grow the Body of Christ in every congregation. This is what discipleship is all about.

Discipleship is being intentional about teaching someone else so that he or she can grow in his or her own faith. Teaching includes everything you do—how you act and react in every situation— and all that you say.

Everyone of us in the church can and should participate in discipleship. Look at these encouraging instructions from Paul to Timothy: "Do not rebuke an older man but encourage him as you would a father, younger men as brothers, older women as mothers, younger women as sisters, in all purity." (1 Timothy 5:1-2)

Scripture also tells us how each group of people—older men, older women, young men and young women—should behave: "² Older men are to be sober-minded, dignified, self-controlled, sound in faith, in love, and in steadfastness. ³ Older women likewise are to be reverent in behavior, not slanderers or slaves to much wine. They are to teach what is good, ⁴ and so train the young women to love their husbands and children, ⁵ to be self-controlled, pure, working at home, kind, and submissive to their own husbands, that the word of God may not be reviled. ⁶ Likewise, urge the younger men to be self-controlled." (Titus 2:2-6)

And one more encouragement for young men and women in the congregation: "Before old age you shall get up, and you shall show respect for an old person; and you shall revere your God; I am Yahweh." (Leviticus 19:32)

Everyone can and should disciple someone else. Discipleship starts with a willing heart. It also helps to do as Jesus encourages us: *"For this is the message that you have heard from the beginning, that we should love one another."* (1 John 3:11)

As part of the Body of Christ, let us walk together as children of God, seeking to disciple each other. This is an exciting opportunity that we have during this Advent—Christmas Season as we prepare to receive from God the Father the greatest gift ever—eternal life through the one- and onlybegotten Son, Jesus Christ.

During this Advent season (Nov. 28—Dec. 24), we're going to dig into the Scriptures to learn what God says about discipleship. Join us for as many services and Bible studies as you're able. God bless you this Advent season!

'The Colors of the Liturgical Seasons'

Blue

Blue, the first color of the "Bg-Bgs-Pwr" scheme, is the more contemporary color increasingly used by many congregations in their observance of a new church year. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. BLUE-the color of the sky-helps convey that powerful message. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in history assuming our flesh, will also return on the last day of time from that same blue sky he ascended long ago.

Our Banners used in Service

It is interesting to note how often Jesus used symbols to illustrate heavenly truths in His teaching. He said: "I am the Light of the world" (John 8:12 RSV). ""Consider the lilies of the field" (Matthew 6:28 RSV). "I am the true Vine" (John:6 RSV). "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field" (Matthew 13:44 RSV). "I am the Good Shepherd" (John 10:11 RSV).

Symbols are the language of Christian art. Since the beginning of the Christin church, religious symbolism has developed as a means by which Christians identify with one another and share their beliefs. Many symbols of the early church remain in art today as visible signs through which an artist is able to impart their understanding of God.



The **Crown** represents the Kingship of Jesus Christ and His place of honor at the right hand of God. A seven-pointed Crown highlights the number seven, which is used 735 times in the Bible. Seven symbolizes completeness and perfection. Although this crown only has 3-points. A symbol of the divine nature of Jesus Christ. A crown also can be used to denote our status as heirs of heaven.

The king's crown was a symbol of his representative rule of the kingdom that was ultimately ruled by God, God is the only true authority, the everlasting King. One day we will see Christ with many crowns on his head, an image of his ultimate authority (Rev 19:12).


