Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

February is most notably known for Valentine's Day. This, as we all know, is a day set aside to celebrate love. We are all familiar with that famous "love chapter" of the Bible, found in 1 Corinthians 13. There, St Paul tells us all about love: how it is patient and kind, not self-seeking or rude, believing, hoping, and enduring all things. What a beautiful picture of love St Paul gives us in this passage! These verses do more than just tell us about love, they tell us about God's love for us. As we consider love this month, it seems fitting that we also consider the other important holiday we find happening this month.

February is also known for the beginning of the season of Lent, marked with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is a day set aside to focus our attention on our sinfulness and our need for a savior. On this day, we are reminded, "we are dust and to dust we shall return." But even as we have this reminder, we remember the love God has shown us. St John writes in 1 John,

"See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him." - 1 John 3:1

Despite being dust, despite the ashen stain of sin upon us, God calls us His children.

Just a little further along in his epistle, St John assures us,

"In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins." - 1 John 4:10

Jesus was sent to be the propitiation, or sacrifice, that pays the price for our sins. God has truly shown us His love. For even as we consider how utterly undeserving we are on Ash Wednesday, even as we begin the Lenten season of contrition and repentance for those sins, we also remember the love of God shown to us in Christ Jesus. John even goes so far as to remind us that it isn't because of our love for God. Our love for God falls short, our love is insufficient, but His love for us is all sufficient.

Therefore, St John calls on us, because we are so loved by God, to also love one another: "Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God." - 1 John 4:7

As we repent of all the sins we have committed and turn to God for His love and forgiveness, we also remember that He has called us to love one another. In our world today there seems to be so much love lost. Anger, hate, violence, these things seem to rule the day. Love for God, love for our neighbor, these seem harder and harder to find in our world today.

As we remember the love God has shown us, we are reminded of another passage that tells us of God's love, John 3:16. There Jesus tells us,

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life." - John 3:16

Holding fast to this faith in our loving savior, we hear the words of Hebrews 10:

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who promised is faithful." And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works," - Hebrews 10:23-24

As we confess our faith in a world where hate seems to rule over love, let us be the ones to show love to the loveless. Let us be the ones to show God's compassion. Let us consider how we can encourage that love in others, rather than stirring up more anger and hate. This after all is what we have been called to. Though we are dust and to dust we shall return, God has shown us His love. For He doesn't call us dust, but His own beloved children.

May we be reflections of His great love,

White is the color of purity and completeness. The theme for the "great fifty days" of Easter is supported by the use of white. This color, used primarily during these Sundays, assists in bearing the message that "though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow." Christ's triumph from the grave on Resurrection day is the cause for our rejoicing. His purity before his Father becomes our purity. White reinforces that message of joy.

Black is seen very seldom during the year. The calendar calls for its use only twice; on Good Friday and Ash Wednesday. There's no mistaking the message that this sober color gives. Black is the absence of light. Good Friday, or Black Friday in combination with Ash Wednesday, calls for sober reflection on the cost of our redemption. Without Christ's sacrifice on the day the sky turned dark and hid the light of the sun, there would be no bright Light of Christ to live in, nor new life in Christ to

Purple, like black, is a penitential color, in contrast to a festive one. It is appropriately used during Lent and, still in many parishes, during the season of Advent. The forty days of Lent, including the six Sundays that fall during this season, use this deep, rich color which has come to represent somberness and solemnity, penitence, and prayer.

Violet or purple was a very cherished and expensive color in the world Jesus lived. The dye used to make the color was painstakingly acquired by massaging the neck of a Mediterranean shell fish that secreted a special fluid. It was therefore afforded only by the rich and worn most exclusively by the


royalty.

**Green**, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year. Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!

CRANBERRY FETA PINWHEELS | Yield: 4tortillas (approx. 45 pinwheels) Total Time: 20 min. +1 hr. optional chill time

Please share your favorite recipe so it can be enjoyed by all of us. Thank you.


**DIRECTIONS** 

Combine all ingredients except tortillas. Mix well. Divide and spread cream cheese mixture evenly between four spinach tortillas. Roll tightly, wrap in clear plastic wrap, and refrigerate for one hour. \*To serve, cut into approximately 12 slices.

There will be a brunch in the basement February 12, everyone is welcome to attend and show a Big St. Matthew welcome to our new members




