Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Perhaps you've already spent a fair bit of time at sporting events watching your children or grandchildren play. And I know that many of you have gardens that you enjoy tending to this time of year.

God has given us a beautiful world to live in. He created it for us. Genesis 1 tells us God gave Adam and Eve all the trees in the Garden of Eden to eat from except for one. 

Green, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year.

Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!





MOM'S CREAM PUFFS

1 C. boiling water
1/2 C. butter
1 C. sifted flour

Recipe submitted by Karen Krusen

1. Melt butter in water.
2. Add flour all at once and stir vigorously; cook, stirring constantly until mixture forms balls that do not separate.
3. Remove from heat and cool slightly.
4. Add eggs, one at a time, beating vigorously after each addition until mixture is smooth.
5. Drop from tablespoon 2 1/2 inches apart onto greased baking sheet.
6. Bake in hot oven (450 degrees) 15 minutes; then in moderate oven (325 degrees) 25 minutes.
7. Remove with spatula and cool on rack.
8. When thoroughly cool, cut side of each puff and then can be filled with a favorite filling.




Stewardship Board


