Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter the summer months I'm sure many of you have vacations on your mind. With school out for the summer I'm sure many students are excited to take a break from learning. But are we ever done learning? The Psalmist understood the need to learn all there is for us to know about the Lord in Psalm 25 we read:

"Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long." - Ps. 25:4-5

As God's children, we are encouraged to have this same desire to be taught by the Lord. We should seek to be led in His paths.

To that end, Mary took the opportunity as soon as it presented itself. In Luke 10 we read of a time when Jesus visited the home of Mary and Martha. Martha was busy with much serving, but as I'm sure many of you remember, Mary sat at Jesus' feet to listen to His teaching. She knew what she needed. FROM THE VICAR:

I enjoy keeping you up to date as best I can as to what is happening in my Specific Ministry Program classes. I do not always have the luxury of putting my thoughts in writing, so it helps immensely when I am just asked in conversation.

June 3, I began my next class. The topic is "Liturgy." For the next ten weeks my class will be looking at various aspects of liturgy, or liturgical worship. Part of my first assignment was to ask various people the following questions

and record their answers; and, my own answers from what I have learned in class. Ouestions/Answers

How do you define Christian worship?

Anytime you are in communication with God.

Reverence or adoration of God by groups of like minded people.

Learning about God and praying to Him.

Giving homage and Glory to God with heart, mind, and soul.

Thanking God for all He's given. Worship for forgiveness and guidance.

It's and act of praising God

Why do Christians worship?

We worship out of habit with a fellowship of believers reaffirming our baptismal vows.

It's a command of scripture. We interact with God as we grow and learn in our relationship to him.

We believe in God and give praise to Him.

We hear, speak, share and participate in prayer and sacraments.

He created and designed us to worship. It's a form of reverence for who is God

Thanking God for all He has done.

Is there such a thing as wrong worship? If so, what would be the consequences?

Continued violation of God's commands. When we come to worship and we would rather be off doing something else.

If you are not divinely inspired to worship. We must be correctly aligned with what God sees as good and correct.

Yes there is such as thing as wrong worship the consequence is Hell.

We must worship with contrite heart for God knows our hearts and will treat us accordingly. If we worship in sin or wishing harm or bad things on another.

Lack of focus on Christ. If our faith is self abiding. Or if we worship something God is against.

Quite a variety of answers! How would you respond? I would begin by saying: Worship is first God coming to me with the means of grace: word and sacrament. The worship I then return is in thankfulness and praise for those gifts. God has initiated everything from Creation to our redemption from sin, death, and the power of the devil through the life, death, and resurrection of our savior Jesus Christ.

A quick and easy prayer before worship each Sunday: "God may you bring your gifts of grace to me."

Vicar Stacy 6-5-2024 <u>Green</u>, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year.

Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!

TREE REMOVAL





 Rhubarb Coffee Cake
 Recipe submitted by Janeal Holmes

 Yield: Serves 12.
 • Cake:

 • Cake:
 • 2 cups flour

 • 1 teaspoon baking soda
 • 1/2 teaspoon salt

 • 1/2 cup shortening or butter, softened

- 1-1/2 cups brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 cup sour cream
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2-1/2 cups fresh rhubarb, cut in chunks
- Topping:
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 tablespoon butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. In a medium bowl mix the flour, soda, and salt, and set aside. In a large mixing bowl, cream together the shortening or butter and the brown sugar, and beat until fluffy. Beat in the egg. Beat in the flour and sour cream alternately until blended. Mix in the vanilla extract and the rhubarb, and spread the batter in a greased and floured 9x13-inch baking pan.

Combine the sugar, nuts, cinnamon, and melted butter; sprinkle over the top. Bake 40 to 50 minutes.


