Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Well, another school year has begun. The kids are back in school and confirmation classes are getting started once again. And I can't help but think of the old saying, "you learn something new every day." As classes begin again, I'm sure this is especially true for our students, but It tends to ring true for all of us. We learn things about our friends, our jobs, and our family. We learn things about the world.

There are all sorts of ways that we can go about learning these new things. The internet is full of places we can go to learn new skills. There are plenty of books out there to teach us about

whatever topic we may be interested in. Or maybe you're one who prefers to learn by doing and so as you set to a task you begin to learn what is needed to accomplish that job.

Students are sent to school to learn. Perhaps your job requires you to take some courses to learn how to operate a new machine or how to use a piece of software. Others take time to learn things simply for the enjoyment of learning something new. Whatever the case, we spend a lot of time in our lives learning.

How much of that learning time is spent studying God's Word? John tells us there's always more we could talk about when it comes to Jesus. In John 21, we read, "Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written." John 21:25 If all the books in the world couldn't contain the works of Christ, I should think we would never stop learning about Him.

David understood this. He writes in the psalms, "Make me to know your ways, O LORD; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all the day long." - Ps. 25;4-5 David knew there was always more to learn. More for God to teach us, whether we are learning about God's commands and all that He righteously requires of us, or about the good news of what He has done for us. We need to learn from Him. Many of those who approached Jesus during His ministry called Him, "rabbi" a term that means "teacher". His disciples spent much of their time learning from Him. In Matthew 13 and others, we hear the disciples approach Jesus asking Him to explain to them the parables He was teaching. They knew they had much to learn from Him. We see this desire to learn from Him not just from the disciples though. In Luke 10, we read, "Now as they went on their way, Jesus entered a village. And a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. And she had a sister called Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to his teaching." - Luke 10:38-39 Mary too wanted to learn all that Jesus had to teach.

And so it should be for us. We should strive to learn all that God has to teach us in His word. In the Old Testament, the people of Israel were encouraged to discuss God's Word as they walked on the road. I was taught my second year of high school that the term sophomore can essentially be translated as "wise fool". The idea being that by that time you are wise enough to know that there's a lot you don't know. If only we could all be sophomore's, wise fools. Understanding that there's always more to learn.

Pastors, teachers, students, old and young alike, all have things we can learn. And so we ought always to be studying God's Word. And so God gives us different opportunities to learn from Him. He has given us His word in our own language that we might study it at home. He gives us opportunity to hear it preached and taught here at church on Sunday as we gather as His people to worship Him and receive His good gifts. And He invites us to join in this learning and teaching as we gather for Sunday School and various Bible Studies. I encourage you as the school year starts to ask yourself now, and throughout the year to come, "what have I learned from God's Word today?" Luther himself didn't think he knew all there was to learn of God's Word. So may we ever be life-long learners. In Christ.

Green, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year.

Lutheran Service Book calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year!




AVENUE OF FLAGS

Salad Luncheon










