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Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

It's almost time for us to gather in our homes for a feast fit for a king. Turkey, ham, potatoes, rolls, various casseroles and salads, pies and other tasty desserts. Of course, we're talking about Thanksgiving. A day that comes once a year, but an activity that hopefully we are doing every day of the year: giving thanks.

Families around the country will gather on this day to give thanks to God for the many blessings He has given us over the past year. And what a blessing it is to have one day dedicated to this task, but God's Word encourages us to make this a constant thing for us as believers.

St Paul calls us to this kind of thanksgiving in Ephesians 5 where he writes:

“giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ” -Eph. 5:20

We are called to be constantly giving thanks for all sorts of different things. But this isn't always so easy to do. We don't always feel very thankful for everything.

God in His Word seems to recognize this and so he says to us:

“Oh give thanks to the LORD, for he is good, for his steadfast love endures forever!” -Ps. 106:1

But here's the great part. Psalm 106 is not the only place God says this in His Word. We are encouraged with these words in 2 Chronicles 7 and 20, Ezra 3, Jeremiah 33, and in many other Psalms. Why should we give thanks? We should give thanks, for the Lord is good and his steadfast love endures forever. We should give thanks for the goodness of God. We should give thanks for His enduring steadfast love.

This steadfast love He has shown to us through His Son. This steadfast love He has lavished upon us through the promise of resurrection. This steadfast love He has shown to His faithful people most clearly through His Son, who loves us, forgives us, heals us, died for us, and rose for us.

God has done wonderful things for us. And for these things and for the many things we don't even notice, we give Him thanks. And yet, our thanksgiving doesn't end there. On occasion, we have the opportunity to sing the Old Testament Canticle, where we find a line from Scripture:

“Oh give thanks to the Lord; call upon His name; make known His deeds among the peoples!”

Just like the previous passage, this verse is mentioned several times in God's Word: Psalm 105, 1 Chronicles 15, and Isaiah 12, to name a few. In addition to giving thanks, we are called on to make known His deeds. To tell others of the things He has done.

God has done marvelous things for us. He has given us victory over sin and death.

St Paul cites this as our reason to give thanks to the Lord in 1 Corinthians 15:

“But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.” -1 Cor. 15:57

God has given us victory, He has given us life and salvation, and He has adopted us as sons, promising us an eternal inheritance through Christ.

We can give thanks in all circumstances, because of the victory Christ has won for us. God has abundantly blessed us. He has poured out his great gifts on us and for this we give Him thanks. It is all we have to offer back to Him. The offertory from Divine Service Settings 1 and 2 says it quite well:

“What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits to me? I offer the sacrifice of thanksgiving.”

We give Him our thanks for all the things He has given us. So, as we conclude many of our services, we wrap up here: “Let us bless the Lord!”

THANKS BE TO GOD.

We cannot give Him anything but our thanks. All we have is a gift from Him, but we can thank Him for those many gifts and we can give Him our thanks and praise. May we remember this as we celebrate Thanksgiving and throughout our lives.




Green, comes next in the acronym and is by far the most common color seen during the year. *Lutheran Service Book* calls for its use during the seasons of Epiphany and Pentecost. The first Sunday following the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21), also known as Easter Sunday, determines the length of these two seasons. The days of Epiphany may entail a total of, but not more than, eight Sundays. The season of Pentecost, on the other hand, can last from 22 to 28 Sundays. Green is the appointed color for all but a few of the Sundays during these seasons. Consequently, green may be used an average of six to eight months of any given liturgical year! Epiphany's message of Christ's revelation to the Gentiles along with the season's traditional emphasis on extending Christ's kingdom through missions, calls for the use of green-the color symbolic of growth.


Blue: the first color of the “Bg-Bgs-Pwr” scheme, is the more contemporary color increasingly used by many congregations in their observance of a new church year. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. BLUE-the color of the sky-helps convey that powerful message. Our Christian faith rests on the hope that Christ, who came in history assuming our flesh, will also return on the last day of time from that same blue sky he ascended long ago.

White is the color of purity and completeness. The theme for the “great fifty days” of Easter is supported by the use of white. This color, used primarily during these Sundays, assists in bearing the message that “though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be white as snow.” Christ's triumph from the grave on Resurrection day is the cause for our rejoicing. His purity before his Father becomes our purity. White reinforces that message of joy.

In addition to its use during Eastertide, white is the appointed color for such festive Sundays as Christmas and its twelve days; Epiphany (Jan. 6) and the first Sunday following it, observed as the Baptism of Our Lord; the Last Sunday after the Epiphany, also known as Transfiguration Sunday; Holy Trinity Sunday; and twenty-one minor festivals and occasions listed on the church year calendar in *Lutheran Service Book*. In all, white serves as the best festive color for the church year.

MEXICAN ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

4 cups shredded zucchini
1/4 cup fine chopped onion
2 jalapeno peppers seeded and finely chopped
4 eggs
1/4 cup vegetable oil
1-1/2 cups baking mix (like Bisquick)
1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Preheat oven to 375.

In large bowl mix zucchini, onion and pepper.

In a smaller bowl beat eggs with oil until combined.

Add to vegetable mixture and stir until combined then add baking mix and cheese. Stir well until baking mix is fully moistened then season with salt and pepper.

Pour into greased rectangular pan and top with more grated cheese and bake 45 minutes.






